"Moving Beyond the Past"



As those of the IDEA Coalition's Implementation Team interact with the various communities within our County, especially with the historically marginalized population, one of the concerns we have repeatedly heard is that "things will never change." The inference here is that nothing will change regarding such things as discrimination, inequity, social injustice, and institutional racism within the boundaries of our County. It is as if our past behaviors keep repeating themselves in the lives of people in our County. Or, to put it another way, we are stuck in the past. The question then becomes, how do we move beyond the past?

To move beyond our past behaviors, we first must realize that we are a people with a history. In other words, every group of people, regardless of race or ethnicity, has inherited the history of its previous generation. Thus, it does matter what side of history we have inherited at this point in life. What matters is that we have come to accept what history has given us.

Second, we must also realize that we are a people with a calling to make an impact to provide a history for the next generation that is better and more united than the one we inherited. In other words, we have not only inherited a past but also a calling to do something regarding this past that will impact the future generation for a better life. What we do with this "calling" will keep us in the past or propel us into a more united future. The question is, will we answer the call, and if so, how will we answer?

I have often said change is something that takes hard work and involves a united commitment from all sectors of our County. In so doing, all sectors of our County must realize and accept its part of history and answer the call to work in unity to provide a more united future for the next generation. The role of the IDEA Coalition's Steering Committee and Implementation Team is to provide an avenue or to be a vehicle (or a bridge) to help all sectors of our County to work together so that the next generation will not have to deal with the issues of discrimination, inequity, social injustice, and institutional racism.

We look forward to working with you as we all answer the call to make an impact of change in our County.

"Who We Are" A Chronicle of Racism in America


Film Screening @ Reg Lenna Center for the Arts
